Minutes of the Meeting November 13, 2009



Meeting Minutes Continued...

Jason Kern reported on a trip to Stephen's Gap, a picturesque open air pit with a second, horizontal entrance. Matt Level reported on a trip to Sinking Cove Cave. This was a wetsuit "pull down" trip, meaning the cavers, on a one way trip through the cave, pull down the rope after each drop. Sinking Cove featured six drops with a 457' difference in elevation from entrance to entrance. Todd reported on a trip to Richard's Cave. The hike to the cave was along and in a stream with small waterfalls and trees uprooted in a recent flood. We had to stop at the third drop in the cave because of too much volume in the waterfall. We might have rappelled through, but frogging up through the waterfall would have been too dangerous. On the way home from TAG we visited Foster Falls, a surface waterfall/rock climbing area.

We talked about our recent Near Normal Grotto Picnic at Clark's Falls Farm, owned by NNG Life Member Alice Fredericks.

A recent eight hour through trip in Crevice Cave in Missouri featured great formations as well as the stinkiest crawl some of us had ever experienced.

Ralph Sawyer described an experience with bad air (this time a higher than normal level of carbon dioxide, we think) in an unnamed cave in Pike County Illinois. No one could catch their breath, so we exited the cave sooner than we normally would.

Gerry Woltering showed a magazine article about a ranger in Mammoth Cave National Park. The ranger's ancestor was a slave explorer in Mammoth.
