# **White Nose Syndrome Found In Indiana**

White Nose Syndrome (WNS) has now come to the Near Normal Grotto's back yard. A bat in Endless Cave in Washington County was confirmed to have WNS. This confirmation was of White Nose Syndrome, not just the *Geomyces destructans* spores, according to unofficial reports. Reports from several Indiana cavers indicate that this will not be the lone case, with several reports of bats flying in southern Indiana near Corydon, and reports of WNS symptoms in bats from other caves. 
