It was noted in the meeting, that such a request doesn't require a formal data request – but just to ask if we have a map, a person need only ask the data custodian.

Colburn: two maps were turned into ISS, as well as updated GIS files.

Camp Vandeventer Project: Moss

Moss: have not been active, there is new executive director, have not met we still know there is one cave there that we do not know the location of. we also know there two caves for which extant maps are incomplete, and we promised [written agreement – is on website, under acts of board] Camp Vandeventer we would re-find the caves (done [one mapped cave is lost even though we looked for it repeatedly, sinkhole entrance is probably refilled]), evaluate caves for possible use by scouts (done), give them a report on the known biology (done), complete mapping of any incomplete cave maps (not done), and to write up a plan to help guide a search for missing scouts in case where they came up missing (not done)

Organizational director's reports

Clifftop Alliance (Carl Daubach):

Carl: ISS had endorsed acquisition of land in the Stemler Cave area. Clifftop did receive a state wildlife grant for the purchase. The appraisal resulted in acquisition not happening. Clifftop also purchased 475 acres (White Rock), most (306) is a nature preserve open to public. Some ISS members helped identify karst features on the site. A mine on this property was assessed, and mapped, a copy is being provided to the ISS by Clifftop.

Carl: Clifftop is a land trust, and part of larger group of land trusts. Illinois Recreational use law has been changed, network of land trusts is seeking to restore under the recreational use law, other forms of recreations activity (beyond hunting).
