
HAMILTON CAVE, IS LOCATED ON THE JOHN BUILDAY CAVE PRESERVE IN FENKLETON COUNTY, WEST VIRGINIA. AT APPROXIMATELY 4-3/4 MILES, IT IS THE LONGEST OF THE CAVES ON THE PROPERTY, AND HAS 265 FEET OF VERTICAL EXTENT. MARKING TOWNS WERE DRAWN BY TOM KAYE AND DAVID MEST. THE FINE MAP WAS DRAWN BY DAVID MEST. HAMILTON CAVE IS A BLUNTO AND TAPE SURVEY CONDUCTED BY HENRIERS AND FRIENDS OF THE D.C. PHOTO OF THE H.S.S. COPYRIGHT 1908 BY DAVID MEST





























TROUT ROCK FORT

The Trout Rock Fort was one in the chain of forts that the Virginia House of Burgesses in March 1756 directed Washington to erect for the defense of settlers in the South Branch Valley. It also marks the end of Gen. Stonewall Jackson's pursuit of the Federals after the Battle of McDowell, May 12, 1862. On this site during the War Between the States, gunpowder was made from saltpeter obtained in a nearby cave.
